## COOL BEANS COMMUNITY GARDEN







## Chalice Minister/Lay Eucharistic Minister

LEM's are lay people who serve at the altar offering the wine at Holy Eucharist. They serve at all Holy Eucharists: Sunday, Wednesday noon, Thursday Episcopal Day School, Baptisms, Weddings (if requested), Funerals, special Holy Days and Ordinations. They wear a black cassock and

white surplice supplied by the church. LEM's substitute if a Lector or Acolyte is not present.

A roster is prepared and mailed by the church secretary as well as a quarterly schedule. If the LEM is unable to serve when scheduled, it is his/her responsibility to find a substitute and inform the church office of the change.

LEM's are trained by the priest. They may also be trained to take consecrated bread and wine to members who are unable to attend church services.

If you are interested in serving the church as an LEM, contact the priest. He will ask you to choose which services are of interest to you. When approved, you will be licensed by the Bishop.

When an infant is baptized, the first greeting card in a packet of 12 is mailed. On the anniversary of the baptism each year, an age appropriate different card is mailed. This concludes when the child is confirmed.

The Church informs the person in charge of the baptism, child's name, parent's names and addresses and dated of the Baptism. The church provides the sets of cards used in this ministry.

If an older child or adult is baptized, an age appropriate card is purchased and mailed. This is a single mailing.

## A gift of Summer Camp is a gift your children will remember forever

Now is one of the more exciting times of the year when we really begin preparing for 2018 Summer Camp! It may be cold outside, but we are focused on those hot but fun-filled summer days that will soon be here.

Our 2018 Summer Camp dates and rates are now available and you can get Camp on your calendar. Camper registration will open in January through our online system.

You may notice that we have re-evaluated and shifted our grade groupings. This does a couple things that we believe will enhance our programs.

First it means that the sessions offered will draw from three grades instead of two. This equates to more campers per session. We know from experience that there is more excitement and energy generated when sessions are larger, and we are confident everyone will enjoy this boost.



We are going to avoid conflicts with the beginning of school by ending our season earlier. This benefits our campers, volunteers, and counselor staff especially. Ending earlier means more are going to be able to serve our campers for the entire summer. We anticipate seeing the most positive effect on Camp Able as our pool of staff and volunteers will not have as many scheduling conflicts.

Recruiting for the 2018 counselors is underway. You might also hear them referred to as the "permanent staff" for the summer. We will be hiring 20 young adults to serve as cabin counselors, one head driver, and one head counselors.

One last thing — this Christman season consider for your children, grandchildren, or a pal you've made at church, the gift of an experience of summer comp at Camp Hardtner. It's a gift they won't outgrow or get bored with. It will stick with them forever.

Chateau Du Lac (an outreach of the Shepherd's Staff Committee)

Chateau du Lac is a 6 story high rise apartment building at the corner of Ryan and Mill Streets. It is housing for low income residents of the city. We have been involved in outreach to this facility for several years. Members of the parish donated new or used household items, furniture and clothing. They also make monetary donations to cover expenses for some of our projects.

#### Projects:

- Twice a year we sponsor the monthly birthday party honoring residents whose birthdays occur that month. We have been assisted in hosting these parties by the McNeese Cowgirl Basketball Team, McNeese Foreign Students and McNeese Canterbury Group.
- We offer Holy Eucharist on the second Monday of each month.
- 3. We offer Ash Wednesday Holy Eucharist and Imposition of Ashes.
- 4. We offer Bible Studies.
- 5. We redecorated a storage area with furniture, rugs, pictures, etc. Which is now called the Peace Garden and used by many groups. The staff has used it as a quiet place for families if a resident dies. The funds for this project were given by the Book Sale.
- 6. Children from St. John Elementary and ICCS have donated "soup in a jar" beans.
- 7. Children from EDS have donated gift bags of food and toys for the dogs, cats, and birds owned by residents.
- 8. Our onsite garage sale was a huge success. The profit from this project was donated to the food pantry.
- The residents have collected non-perishable foods to donate to the food pantry.
- 10. We have provided prizes for in-house Bingo.
- 11. We have had Memorial Services for three of the residents.
