Good Shepherd's annual meeting was held Sunday, January 20, 2019, following the 10:30 a.m. service. Becky Watson, Senior Warden opened the meeting with a prayer.

Ballots were distributed for voting for 3 vestry members and 4 Diocesan Convention Delegates. New vestry members will be elected for a 3-year term on the vestry. Henry Riquelmy is going off after serving 3 years. Susan Ardoin is also going off after filling a 1-year unexpired term for someone. Watson reviewed nominees for vestry. Mary Jones was nominated from the floor by Pam Spears. There will be four delegates to the convention and one alternate. Parishioners then voted and several designated people left the meeting to count the votes. Vestry members elected for a 3-year term are Susan Ardoin, Charles Dalglish, and Martha Hoskins. Convention delegates are Becky Watson, Ann Lindsay, Martha Hoskins, Martha Whelan. Ellen McAdon will serve as an alternate if needed.

Financially, Good Shepherd Church experienced a solid year in 2018, according to Stuart Weatherford, treasurer. The church is ahead of 2018 budget by approximately \$20,000.

After voting, vestry members gave presentations on the state of our finances, the Spirit Committee, EDS/Good Shepherd joint projects, and an overview by the Senior Warden.

Ben Williams - The vestry formed the Spirit committee in hopes of gathering information about the parish and its members. Another goal of the committee was to identify areas of the church that have been neglected or that needed more attention. The data produced from this process gave us better insight into who we are as a community and informed us for future decisions.

We designated 140 families to contact, with a 61% response rate. The data was organized and presented to the vestry for review. Through several work sessions the vestry was able to make a list of the most popular areas of needed improvement.

#1 - More involvement with EDS

#2 - Youth focus (choir, service focus, music, focus on ages 10-14)

#3 - Church attendance / #4 - Finances (tie)

#4 - Youth group (organized)

Three of the four above mentioned goals would be accomplished through a greater involvement with Bishop Noland Episcopal Day School. The ministry to the school would foster a greater appeal to families with young children and then church attendance would be increased and youth involvement would increase.

Martha Whelan -The Vestry and Mother Boo Kay identified ways we could strengthen the bonds between the church and the day school. 2 immediate ways to strengthen bonds between the church and Episcopal Day School.

**Identify and share events that would appeal to both church and school.**

**Identify opportunities for Good Shepherd members to donate their time and talent to Episcopal Day School.**

Good Shepherd members generously volunteered to assist in many ways. Jan Ware and Ellie Marquez are teaching cursive writing to 3<sup>rd</sup> graders. Sarah Harmon is helping with art projects. Kay House will assist with Mother's Tea in May. Art teacher will work with students on special projects. Glenda Williams, Pam Spears, Sara Bass, Emily Williams, Dr. Raggio, Allison Ash, Mary Richardson and Denise Rau are assisting with other opportunities at the school.

Becky Watson, Senior Warden started her report with accolades to Margie Collins and Ann Lindsay. These two women are amazing. They run the church offices, answer the door, the telephones, assist with requests from parishioners as well as individuals off the street. Their dedication is heartwarming. Be sure to tell them *thank you* for all they do for us.

Last year when Bishop Owensby visited Good Shepherd, he suggested signage inside and outside the church was very important. He explained that if someone was visiting and had to search for the nursery or restrooms, there is a good chance they would not come back. I am happy to announce Good Shepherd has new indoor and outdoor signage.

The greatest accomplishment for myself in 2018 is the music program. Pam LeBlanc and Lamar Robertson make glorious music. The choir is amazing. A special thank you to Sharon Allured, Janet Allured, & Sarah Harmon for their help in making the music program a success.

As we begin 2019 the church's focus will turn to finding a new rector- a rector that can spiritually lead Good Shepherd. The vestry is contracting with **Holy Cow Consulting**, to conduct an online survey of parishioners. Watch your inbox for an email. Please take the time to respond to the survey.

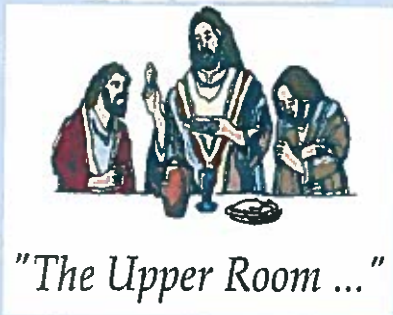

### Mamie “Ginger” Tatum’s recipe for Banana Nut Bread

1/4 lb. oleo or butter

1 cup sugar

2 eggs

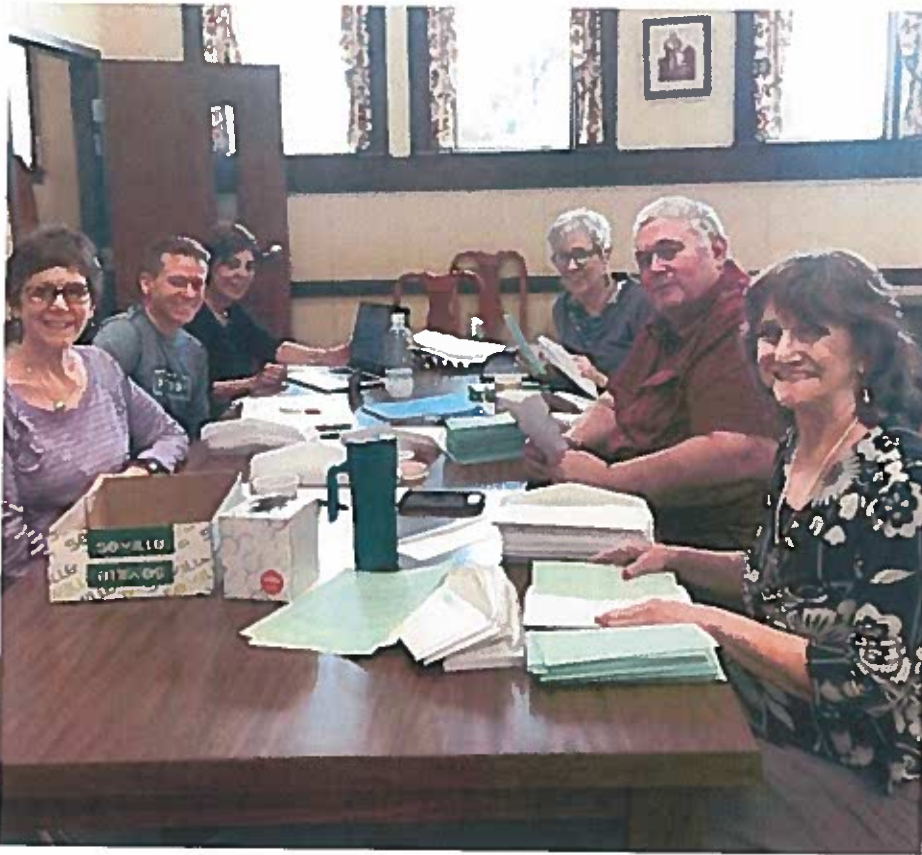
1/2 cup pecans, finely chopped

2 cups flour

1 tsp baking soda

3 very ripe bananas, crushed

Whip bananas until light. Cream butter & sugar and add eggs. Sift flour and add baking soda– add to butter and eggs. Combine this mixture with the finely chopped pecans, than add crushed bananas. Pour into a greased loaf pan and bake at 350° for 1 hour. Yield: 1 loaf

What does that mean? It is time for Confirmation, Receptions and Reaffirmations.

If you are interested in Confirmation, Reception, or Reaffirmation, please sign up on the bulletin board or email Mother Boo at [bkay@episcopaldayschool.org](mailto:bkay@episcopaldayschool.org).

**Confirmation** is laying on of hands by our Bishop Jake Owensby. It is to confirm the promises others made for you at your baptism, or to confirm your desire to be a member of The Episcopal Church.

**Reception** occurs if you have previously been confirmed in the Roman Catholic, Orthodox or ELCA Lutheran churches and now want to become a member of the Episcopal Church.

**Reaffirmation** occurs if you were previously confirmed as an Episcopalian, but now would like to reaffirm those vows.

Mother Boo Kay will be teaching these classes over 4 – 6 meetings lasting approximately one and a half to two hours each at a mutually agreeable time. They may be either after school or on Sundays following the service.

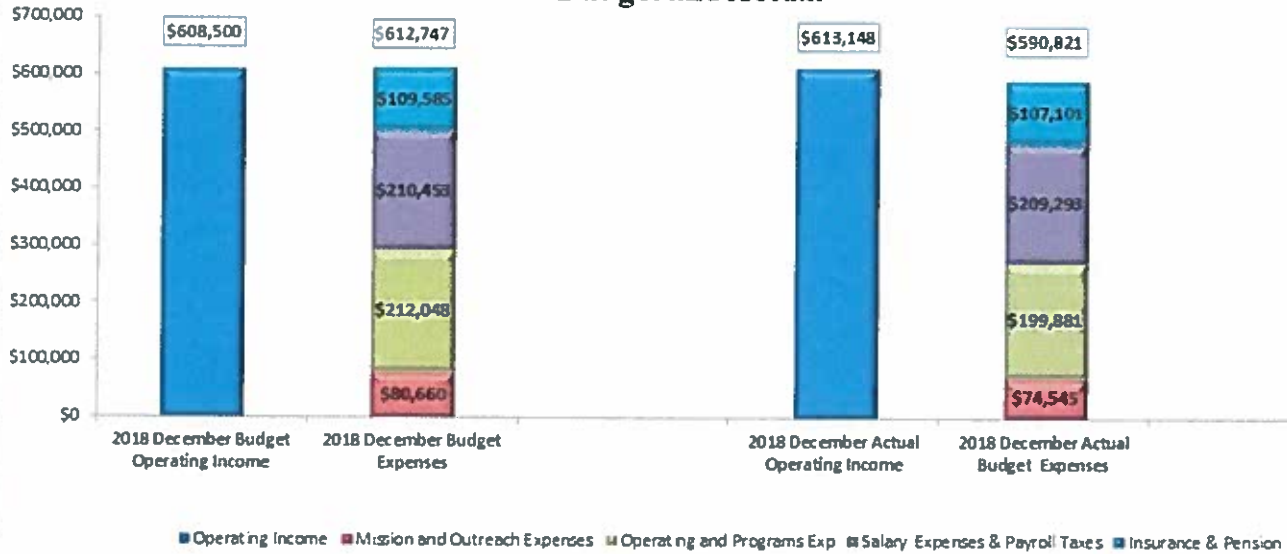

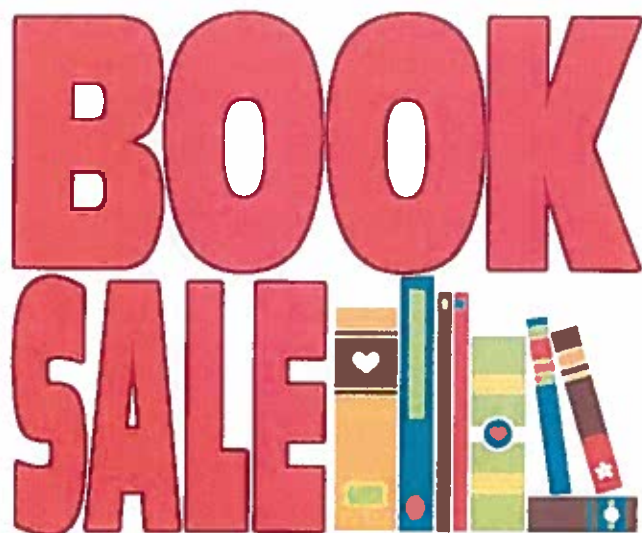
